Smoke detectors save lives!






If your house is on fire and you are inside a closed room, feel the door before you open it to see if it is hot. Breathing smoke can be very dangerous! Heat rises, so there will be more smoke higher in the room. Get on your hands and knees and crawl to the nearest exit away from the fire.



Be Safety Smart!




- When you enter a public building make certain to know where the nearest exits are located. Fires can happen anywhere!
- Always be very careful to make certain your campfire is completely out. You can either cover it with dirt or have an adult help you pour water on the coals.
- It is important to keep your fireplace and chimney clean. You can have a chimney sweep clean your chimney every year before you start using the fireplace.
- Be careful in the kitchen. Never put anything near the stove burners. Watch out for grease fires!
- Be careful during the holidays! Never put your tree near a fireplace or heat register.
- Never use the elevator if you are in a burning building.
 Use the stairs. Be sure to check the door for heat before opening. Also check for smoke in the stairwell.

If your clothing should catch on fire it is important to remember not to run. You can put out the fire if you remember to **STOP, DROP and ROLL.** If the sleeves of your clothes are not on fire use your arms to cover and protect your face.
