
## Buckle Up For Safety

As you get older you will need a booster seat so the safety belt fits correctly across your lap, shoulder, and chest.




All passengers, including those who ride in the backseat, should wear safety belts.



Safety belts hold you in place, protecting you from injuries caused by sudden or unexpected stops and accidents.




A safety belt will help keep you safe in a vehicle. It is very unsafe and dangerous not to wear your safety belt at all times.



Be responsible and tell everyone in the vehicle to be sure and buckle up their safety belts.




When you first get into a vehicle, what is the first thing that you are going to do?




Always remember that safety seats for children are required by law, so always use them and buckle up.
