






If you have a live tree make certain to water it every day. Always check all decorations to make certain they are working properly before decorating the tree. Use cool lights that have a safety approval rating.

## WINTER SAFETY








Be careful when playing in the snow. Always make certain the snowballs don't contain any rocks or other objects before throwing them. Never throw snowballs at passing vehicles, or at homes or windows.






Play in a safe area. Never play near the road, or on the mounds of snow left by the snowplow near the road. Snow and ice can make the sidewalks very slippery. Always be careful when crossing the street, walking along the sidewalk, or climbing building steps.







Sled only on slopes that are clear of trees and other objects. Pay attention and always watch for other sledders to make certain it is clear before going downhill or starting your walk back up. Walk up the hill on the side out of the way of the other sledders.
